Subject: GENERAL ORDER: Support for I-1351 Class Size Counts ballot initiative.

Background

The State Supreme court has ruled in the "McLeary" lawsuit that class size is one of the issues that the legislature must address in living up to its paramount duty to amply fund public education. Washington State still ranks 47th in the nation in class size (teacher to student ratio) showing that the legislature has done little to date to provide satisfactory funding for public education.

Decreased class size is a clear, common sense factor in students' attainment of an education. Educators universally favor smaller class sizes as one of the most effective ways to help students succeed.

A successful class size initiative will force the legislature to take on the topic of revenue reform to the benefit of working people, their families and the next generation.

The Class Size Counts ballot initiative has been filed and signature gathering is underway.
