The NW New Hire Committee was formed in 2006 with the charter:

Northwest New Hire Committee – This committee will work with the NW Council in developing methods of outreach to new members coming into SPEEA. They will also work with the elected leadership, NW Council and staff to make SPEEA a more welcoming organization to our newer members, and to create opportunities for new members to develop into the SPEEA leaders of the future.

On July 30, 2015, the 58th IFPTE convention unanimously passed resolution #22. Rev 2, "Investing in Our Future – Young Workers and Youth Engagement "

- 2 The strength and vitality of the labor movement depends heavily on the ability
- 3 of younger union members to develop into strong and effective labor leaders;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS

- 6 The AFL-CIO and its affiliate unions recognized this during their 2013
- 7 convention by passing a resolution expressing that a powerful labor
- 8 movement can be built only through recognition and inclusion of the full
- 9 diversity of the labor, including workers of all ages; and,
- 10 WHEREAS,
- 11 The resolution called for the AFL-CIO and its affiliates to actively develop
- 12 initiatives and programs aimed at bringing young workers into the labor
- movement and become more active within their unions;
- 14 and,
- 15 WHEREAS
- 16 Passage of the AFL-CIO young workers resolution resulted in many
- startup young workers groups across the country; two successful national
- 18 summits that attracted and engaged hundreds of young workers and union
- members, including IFPTE members, activists and community partners; and,
- 20 WHEREAS,
- 21 The young worker groups developed deeper skills for young workers to build
- 22 capacity, run programs in their communities, and educate the public on the
- 23 importance of labor unions; and,
- 24 WHEREAS,

- 27 and unaffordable college loans, young workers face unprecedented

- WHEREAS.
- 30 In conjunction with the larger labor movement, I FPTE must recognize these
- 31 challenges for IFPTE members and young workers in general; and,
- 32 WHEREAS
- 33 Advancing leadership training for young workers groups within LFPTE is an
- 34 important step in ensuringfew the Federation's continued and future growth,
- and ability to properly and successfully represent our members;
- 36 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,
- 37 That the Federation and its affiliated Locals recognize and support youth-
- 38 oriented strategic initiatives and partnerships developed in Canada and the
- 39 United States, in workplaces, on campuses and in concert with a broad array
- 40 of like-minded student, youth, advocacy and comm unity organizations to help
- 41 expand and strengthen the labor movement overall, IFPTE and its affiliated
- 42 locals in particular, and build a just
- 43 economy for all workers.

- 44 THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED,
- 45 That the Federation establish a "Young M embers" Committee, open to
- 46 young member from every Local, which should convene twice
- 47 annually and for those locals who are notable to meet in person shall
- 48 participate by electronic means in order to share our
- 49 successes and struggles on matters relevant to young members within the
- 50 Labor M ovement, and to facilitate the creation and adoption of unified
- 51 strategies to engage with and build the future lead ers within every IFPTE
- 52 Local, and the communities they serve. Any financial costs incurred will be
- 53 borne by the participating local.

On August 26, 2015, the Northwest New Hire Committee approved a request to the Northwest Council to recharter the committee, to reflect the needs of our union and alignment with IFPTE.

Young Member involvement is what SPEEA needs. This does not exclude more seasoned SPEEA member involvement in the committee.

MOTION

It is moved that: THE NORTHWEST COUNCIL APPROVES RECHARTERING THE NORTHWEST NEW HIRE COMMITTEE:

NORTHWEST NEW HIRE YOUNG MEMBERS COMMITTEE – THIS COMMITTEE WILL WORK WITH THE NW COUNCIL IN DEVELOPING METHODS OF OUTREACH TO NEW MEMBERS COMING INTO SPEEA. THEY THE COMMITTEE WILL ALSO WORK WITH THE ELECTED LEADERSHIP, NW COUNCIL AND STAFF TO MAKE SPEEA A MORE WELCOMING ORGANIZATION TO OUR NEWER YOUNG MEMBERS, AND TO CREATE OPPORTUNITIES FOR NEW YOUNG MEMBERS TO DEVELOP INTO THE SPEEA LEADERS OF THE FUTURE.
