Subject: PRESUBMITTED NEW BUSINESS: Hazard Pay for Essential Workers

Background

Affected union represented grocery store employees represented by UFCW Locals 21, 367, 1439 & 81 and Teamsters Local 38.

SPEEA was supported by UFCW (United Food and Commercial Workers) & Teamsters during our strike in 2000. Currently, approximately 25,000 Puget Sound grocery store workers from 3 unions (UFCW Locals 21, 367, 1439 & 81 Meat cutters, Teamsters local 38 Snohomish county), are working to receive a "pandemic" pay boost because of Covid 19.

Union Grocery Stores:

National Chains - Kroger (Includes QFC & Fred Meyer), Safeway (Includes Albertsons).

Independents – Many independent stores.

On January 25, 2021, the Seattle City Council voted 8-0 approving legislation to reinstate hazard pay for grocery store workers.

This legislation will require employers pay those workers an extra \$4 an hour to "compensate grocery employees for the risks of working on the frontlines of a global pandemic," while also encouraging them to continue working and improving access to resources to keep them healthy.

MOTION

It is moved that: The NW Council supports the UFCW Local 21 and similarly affected unions to obtain hazard pay for essential workers during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prior to council action (voting) to determine a legislative or public affairs position, the Northwest Council's Legislative & Public Affairs Committee shall investigate and produce both pro and con statements and a majority committee recommendation.

Passage or adoption of any legislative or public issue proposal shall be by published ballot and require: A majority vote of all Council Members present.
