## Background

SPEEA members support other union members who have been forced to go on strike to achieve decent contracts and respect form the companies that employ them.

UNITE HERE union representing hotel workers has a nationwide issue with the Marriot Hotel chain and its management.

The workers are demanding: protection against sexual harassment, issued panic buttons to summon hotel security, significant wage increases bringing wages to above the poverty line, full time employment instead of multiple jobs. Marriott has not been responding to union offers.

As of Monday, more than 7,700 Marriott hotel workers are on strike as housekeepers, desk attendants and other non-management employees struck in Boston, San Francisco, San Jose, Oakland, Detroit, San Diego and Hawaii.

UNITE HERE Local 8 in Seattle approved by over 98% to authorize a strike

Throughout this campaign, UNITE HERE's message to Marriott has been simple: One Job Should Be Enough. Marriott is the largest and the richest hotel employer, and they can do better. There is no reason why Marriott employees across the country should be going to work in pain, losing sleep over reduced hours, or struggling to pay rent, while Marriott buys back stock and funnels profits to its shareholders.
