SPEEA-Boeing leaders discuss future of engineering

PVERETT – At a meeting with SPEEA leaders, Boeing commercial and defense executives said they recognize the need to bring back some of the engineering work sent to suppliers in the past.

"The future of Boeing depends on having the right skills in the workplace," said SPEEA President **Tom McCarty**, after the Partnership Leadership Team meeting July 27. "SPEEA and Boeing leaders will continue to work together to identify the critical engineering and technical paths

that Boeing needs to maintain its competitive leadership in aerospace products."

At the meeting, Commercial Airplanes (BCA) Engineering Vice President **Mike Delaney** shared his vision for the future of engineering. "Working jointly to resolve issues will allow us to develop and produce the highest levels of quality, safety and product integrity our customers expect coupled with great business results."

Conrad Ball, Puget Sound Boeing Defense, Space & Security chief engineer,

agreed. "We all benefit when we share the same goals and understanding of the challenges and opportunities we face."

The 2008-2012 SPEEA Prof and Tech contracts (Article 20) lay the ground-work for the Partnership Leadership Team meetings. The team meets at least twice a year to discuss potential business changes that may impact the SPEEA-represented workforce. The next meeting is planned for November.

Regence insurance error from short plan year

ICHITA – More than 40 SPEEA-IFPTE Local 2001-represented employees in the Wichita Engineering Unit (WEU) at Boeing were affected by an error in out-of-pocket and deductible payments in 2009 and 2010.

The error only affected Wichita engineers at The Boeing Company on the Traditional Medical Plan (TMP), which called for the deductibles and out-of-pocket expenses that were paid during the 2009 short plan year to be credited to the 2010 calendar year deductible and out-of-pocket expenses. Regence BlueShield believed they fixed all of the claims processing errors earlier in the year, but missed at least one member who contacted SPEEA in July.

"Regence knew about the problem in February, but never alerted SPEEA," said **Matt Kempf** SPEEA benefits director. "SPEEA has requested multiple times to be notified in real time of systemic claims-processing errors that affect our members, and our request has been repeatedly denied. It's important to check every explanation of benefits (EOB) you receive

and contact us if you have con-

The SPEEA-WEU/Boeing contract - Letter of Understanding (LOU 24) states:

Deductible

Expenses applied toward medical and dental plan deductibles for claims incurred from July 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009 will also be credited toward medical and dental plan deductibles for claims incurred January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010

Out of pocket maximums (applie medical only)

Expenses applied toward the

plan out-of-pocket maximum for claims incurred from July 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009 will also be credited toward the medical plan out-of-pocket maximum for claims incurred January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010.

The handling of the short plan year is different in the Puget Sound contracts. During the short plan year, the Puget Sound contracts cut the annual deductible and the maximum out-of-pocket in half. See Prof and Tech contracts' LOU 27.

Did the rollover error affect you?

If you're in the SPEEA-Boeing WEU and enrolled in TMP, go to www.myregence. com and check your medical claims from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2009 (the short-plan year). Any amounts you paid under the 2009 deductible or out-of-pocket maximum should be credited to your 2010 calendar year deductible and out-of-pocket maximum. magine if your child had a tonsillectomy before your new employer's medical coverage took effect. The costs could become a huge financial burden. In this case, the SPEEA Temporary Medical Plan provided coverage because the new hire signed up as a member within the first 10 days of employment.

This benefit is provided by SPEEA to cover medical expenses and emergencies before the company coverage begins. As an employee of The Boeing Company, SpiritAerosystems or Triumph Composite Systems, Inc, medical coverage is not effective until the first day of the month follow-

ing the new-hire date.

Remind new employees in your area about the temporary coverage that begins the day a completed and signed membership application (including the temporary medical coverage enrollment portion) is received in the SPEEA offices.

Dependent coverage is also available for spouses and children, but only if the new employee lists his or her dependent's names on the enrollment form.


Opening on the Judicial Review Committee
