AFL-CIO president at state labor convention

ENATCHEE, Wash. – SPEEA's delegates to the Washington State Labor Council (WSLC) heard the nation's top union leader urge accountability in aerospace tax incentives.

AFL-CIO President **Richard Trumka** gave a strong call-out to SPEEA and the Machinists for their efforts to make aerospace companies accountable.

"To pocket state tax incentives and then kill good Washington jobs, after sacrifices you and your union members made, it's just shameful," Trumka said at the WSLC annual state labor convention held this year in Wenatchee.

Trumka, the keynote speaker, also gave kudos to other Washington state unions' efforts to increase wages, improve workers' rights and guarantee paid sick leave.

Community support 'humbling' for Auburn member Auburn member UBURN, Wash. - Lynn Reynolds, an

Lynn Reynolds, an Auburn Area Rep, knew about the tension with leadership at Green River Community College (GRCC) where he teaches design drafting classes parttime at night.

He didn't realize how much of the community supported GRCC's teachers trying to save the drafting department along with 10 other areas of study that faced elimination.

Through multiple efforts, including events organized by Sound Alliance, the college president resigned and the 11 departments are no longer on the chopping block.

"It was amazing to learn all the kinds of organizations that come together," said Reynolds. "It was a humbling experience."

SPEEA is a charter member of Sound Alliance and Reynolds, a former Council Rep, is also a SPEEA labor advisory representative for Green River where he teaches.

Sound Alliance became involved because the Kent Education Association (one of the Sound Alliance member organizations) asked for help to save the programs at the college where many Kent graduates go.

Efforts included a three-day teachers strike at the college in May, along with a press conference and a community meeting with a trustee of the college who heard many success stories from programs' graduates, including Reynolds, and said she changed her mind as a result.

Peter Hasegawa, lead organizer for Sound Alliance, shared this at the Northwest Council meeting July 14, along with Reynolds. "It's a victory story and SPEEA played a critical role," Hasegawa said.

Wichita Council Rep a 'hacker' for a cause

Ben Blankley's 'day job'
as a systems integration
engineer has little to do
with coding, but in his
free time, he's surrounded by coders.

He belongs to Open Wichita, which is a Code for America bri-

gade of volunteers interested in creative technical solutions to increase access to open government data.

"My interest is in governmental transparency and non-profit transparency," he said recently following a city-wide Open Wichita hackathon. "With transparency, we figure we could make a difference."

He's no stranger to community involvement and transparency. Through his leadership roles in the Wichita Community Theatre, he spearheaded a transparency policy during an overhaul of the governing documents. In the four years since those changes were implemented, the theater's revenue doubled and donations skyrocketed.

Blankley joined Open Wichita about a year ago and has become the Community Engagement Director.

One of the first ideas he helped work on with Open Wichita led to a smartphone app to track the location of buses and estimated times of arrival. An initial 'proof of concept,' led to the city contacting its software vendor to include most of what Open Wichita designed in the initial app. No additional funding was necessary.

Open Wichita includes members such as Blankley, an aircraft engineer at Spirit AeroSystems, as well as city/county government workers, media specialists and data scientists.

At this year's Riverfest hackathon, part of a national Code for America event, volunteers could join teams after hearing one-minute pitches. Blankley's idea, to easily report graffiti for removal, was implemented.

Blankley, who is also SPEEA Diversity Committee secretary, has served as an Area Rep before becoming a SPEEA Council Rep in 2015.

"I became a Council Rep," he said, "because I wanted to help my coworkers in a big way."




