The docu-drama covered Turing's role in breaking the German spy code during World War II through his invention of a computing machine and his subsequent persecution by the British government for being gay.

At a Q/A via televideo following the movie, Patrick Sammon, executive producer, shared how the movie, an independent film, is spreading around the world. More than 3 million have watched the movie in dozens of countries.

"Hopefully this story has an impact where the LGBTQ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer) community is not treated equally," he said.

Until his move, he served his coworkers as a Council Rep and Area Rep in Commercial Aviation Services (CAS) at the Duwamish site. He also served on the SPEEA negotiations teams for the 2002 and 2005 contracts.

Rich Plunkett, SPEEA director of strategic development, remembers Gaudette for being outspoken. "He was always looking out for the members," Plunkett said.

A celebration of Gaudette's life is planned for Oct. 2 in Chehalis, Wash. Details are still being finalized.

"Your life belongs to the railroad," said **Herb Krohn** (on the left in photo), president of United Transportation Union Local 1348, about the demanding on-call schedule, lack of sick leave, and minimum crew levels that put staff and the community at risk.

At the Council pre-meeting Aug. 11, he asked



for support to change laws affecting railways. "The railroads have way more clout, money and power than we do," he said, asking individuals to contact their lawmakers.

Following the speaker, the Northwest Council heard reports and announcements along with workplace 'good of the union.' No motions were brought to a vote at this meeting.


