Executive Board election information online

If you are interested in running for president, treasurer or secretary on SPEEA's Executive Board, the election information is at www.speea.org.

Candidate requirements as well as a petition are included in the Executive Board election information booklet at **www.speea.org** along with the election timeline. The earliest date to submit a petition is Jan. 10.

The Executive Board directs SPEEA's activities through the executive director, prepares the annual budget and monitors expenses. Board members also serve as the team for any interim negotiations that may occur between formal bargaining sessions.

Watch for open enrollment confirmation

If you're in a SPEEA-Boeing bargaining unit, watch your mail for the Boeing confirmation of election (COE) letter regarding Boeing's annual open enrollment. Among other things, your COE letter informs you which medical and dental plan you are enrolled in and which of your family members have coverage.

If there is a mistake, you have 20 days from the date on the COE letter to correct a mistake. You may correct mistakes by calling Boeing's Total Access at (866) 473-2016.

If you're a newer SPEEA activist, consider applying for the Labor Notes conference in Chicago April 6-8. This weekend-long training brings together union members from across the country to learn, network and take action.

Lessons learned from 40 years

Council Rep Tom Krogel and former Council Rep Lynn Reynolds are among those who reached 40 plus-year milestones at The Boeing Company this year.

Tom Krogel recruiting paid off

ent Council Rep Tom Krogel, an electrical engineer, credits former Council Rep Gordon Todd with recruiting

"He (Todd) was always friendly, always smiling and always chatting with people," said Krogel. When Todd transferred,

he urged Krogel to run for the Council Rep vacancy. "He was persistent," noted Krogel.

One of Krogel's "biggest positives" as a SPEEA Council Rep came when a member, with the help of SPEEA, successfully appealed a retention rating drop. The member was so happy, he signed up to fill a Council Rep vacancy, Krogel said. Now they work together to make sure members in their district know about SPEEA.

Over the decades, Krogel weathered major changes at Boeing without a layoff. He credits "excellent managers" who helped him through the rough spots.

Growing up, his family was not pro-union because of his father, a chemist who managed a paper mill with labor trouble.

Krogel views unions from a different perspective. "I see the inherent advantage of union representation - having someone other than the company as an advocate for you."

He added: "I believe in SPEEA and the good (positive) nature of the union - they're here for the good of the membership."

ormer Council Rep **◀** and Area Rep **Lynn** Reynolds, who always worked drafting support, admits when he started at Boeing, he "didn't know squat about unions."

Jack Roland, he started to learn. "He (Roland) took me under his wing

and explained the power of a union. With his leadership, I became a member."

Reynolds grew up in a family that thought unions were "worthless" but credits his wife for understanding what unions are all about. "Just try to go ask your boss to improve your benefits. I learned early on what unions got," he said. "I just wish, looking back, I would have gotten more involved."

He appreciated the time he served as a Council Rep, which includes the opportunity to attend annual leadership training and convention. "The speakers were very moving."

He primarily worked in the south Puget Sound, including Kent, the Developmental Center, Plant II in Seattle, and Auburn. For 17 years, he worked with a team of 13 engineers for Boeing's internal architectural firm, BEC Engineers, before the group's work was outsourced. For the past 20 years, he worked in facilities in Auburn. He took a Voluntary Lay Off (VLO) offer in October after 44 years with the company.

He also served as a SPEEA labor advisory rep for the Green River Community College, where he still teaches architectural and structural drafting part time.
