# SPEEA members approve new, six-year contract with Spirit AeroSystems

ICHITA – More than 1,620 technical and professional workers represented by SPEEA at Spirit AeroSystems have a new, six-year contract.

The contract was approved by an overwhelming majority of union members in the Wichita Technical and Professional Unit (WTPU). The final count showed 385 voted to accept the agreement and 89 voted to reject.

The agreement, which takes effect immediately, was negotiated one year ahead of the previous contract's scheduled expiration.

"We were able to secure a number of improvements needed and sought by members," said SPEEA Midwest Director **B.J.**Moore. "There was an opportunity to negotiate early and avoid getting pushed up against a hard deadline, and it worked out."

The new contract provides annual raises, increased overtime pay and provides a \$2,000 signing bonus along with unrestricted stock with a value of at least \$1,500. Employees also agreed to changes to their medical plans that phase-in during the contract.

"There is something in this contract for everyone," said SPEEA WTPU Negotiation Team Chair **Mark Gayer**. "We had a lot of open and transparent discussions on the subjects that mattered to employees."

The SPEEA Negotiation Team and the Bargaining Unit Council (WTPU Council Representatives) unanimously recommended members accept the negotiated agreement.

The new contract takes the place of the previous agreement and remains in effect through Jan. 31, 2026.

# CR's 'meet and greet' lunch meeting helps with member outreach

ute to Plant II Council Rep Stan Huang's problem connecting with members in his area. The 10-minute walk between buildings in his district doesn't help.

He knew "at least half" of the members in his district probably had no idea what a Council Rep does, so

At the meet and greet, he also introduced SPEEA Treasurer Jimmie Mathis and SPEEA Secretary Ryan Rule who attended along with Hillary McConnell, SPEEA contract administrator for Plant II.

Huang urged members to sign up as Area Reps at the meeting. He also asked about

their interests for future SPEEA meetings. Retirement and early/mid-career financial planning topics were top vote getters, along with a question and answer session with SPEEA Executive Director **Ray Goforth**.

"My plan is to engage members and give them the ability to vote on lunchtime meeting topics," Huang said. "It gets them involved. They appreciate that."

Huang did not expect to be active in a union when he started at Boeing in 2012. "Being in a union for engineers seemed kind of strange," he said.

Once he started to see the benefits of SPEEA, he saw the difference.

"I'm glad to be in a union," he said. "I can talk to someone about benefits and someone is there for us for support. That's really important to me and my family."
