# SPEEA leaders urge members to vote 'Accept'

embers are casting their ballots for the Constitutional Referendum.

Ballots are due no later than noon, Wednesday, Oct. 26. Ballots arriving after that time, regardless of postmark, cannot be counted.

Throughout the Northwest and Midwest, SPEEA leaders connected with hundreds of members to answer questions and explain why this referendum to streamline the organizing process is good for everyone.

### If approved, what changes?

Instead of an all-member vote to approve an organizing drive for employees outside of Boeing or Spirit, the SPEEA Council will vote to approve. Votes on contracts and all other union elections stay exactly as they are today.

### **Get out the vote**

SPEEA leaders and staff are helping get out the vote by calling Council, Area Reps and union activists to discuss the Constitutional Referendum, answer questions and ask for a vote to 'Accept.'

### **Results online**

After ballots are counted and results certified by the Tellers Committee, which oversees SPEEA elections, the outcome will be announced at **www.speea.org**. Also look for the news in a home email from SPEEA or a message from your Council/Area Rep.

Depending on the timing of the referendum results, the Oct. 28 SPEEA News, which will also feature the news, could be delayed.

### Union to talk with company

# **Spirit's 'Bring Your Own Device'** does NOT apply to SPEEA

ICHITA, Kan. - SPEEA asked Spirit AeroSystems to answer some basic questions and address concerns about the company's request to include union-represented employees in a new - Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) - policy requiring the use of personal cell phones for company business.

The policy – which took effect for non-union employees Oct. 6 – does not include SPEEArepresented employees. While Spirit has "requested" SPEEA-represented employees be included in the new policy, the union is awaiting answers before proceeding.

SPEEA has expressed multiple concerns regarding the company's access to personal cell phones and the personal information and data they contain. As outlined for non-union employees, Spirit's policy requires users download a company application to their telephones. Requiring a proprietary application brings in additional concerns about cell phone compatibility, Department of Defense clearances and liability in the case of data loss.

After SPEEA receives answers to these questions, we will determine next steps. SPEEA is determined to protect union-represented employees and to ensure the company respects employees' privacy, does not place employees in jeopardy and does not unduly intrude on work-life balance. # **Union approval rating climbs to 71%**

ASHINGTON, D.C. – Union approval keeps climbing, according to the latest Gallup poll. Compared to last year's 68% approval rating, the newest data shows 71% of Americans approve of labor unions.

This is the highest percentage of union approval since 1965.

The higher approval rating may come as no surprise, given the daily headlines on union organizing with successes at giant corporations, including Amazon and Starbucks.

In a separate poll earlier in the summer, Gallup asked about union membership.

The results show:

### Who's in a union

- Front-line and production workers 20%
- Health care and social assistance 13%
- White-collar professionals 11%
- Administrative and clerical roles 10%
- Managerial roles 6%

Gallup has measured the public's rating of labor unions periodically beginning in 1936, and annually starting in 2001. Since conducting the poll annually, more Americans have expressed approval than disapproval in every reading.

WSLC membership includes delegates from 600 union locals and councils representing about 550,000 union members.
