IFPTE Local 160

Members approve contract after strike

ISSISSAUGA, Ontario – Members of the Society of United Professionals (SUP) IFPTE Local 160 have returned to work with a better contract after a 13-day strike against their employer, the Electrical Safety Authority in the province of Ontario, Canada.

SUP represents product safety specialists and engineers, as well as IT technicians, analysts and technical advisors working at the authority. The authority is a government agency that administers Ontario's Electrical Safety Code.

The walkout started Sept. 20, after four months of negotiations, which included meetings with a labor conciliator from the Canadian Ministry of Labor.

"Our members at the ESA have been falling behind in a number of ways, and we are looking for a fair and equitable deal that gets us what other employees in the company already have," Society Vice President Robert Mitchell told Ontario news website insauga.

The strike brought the employer back to the bargaining table. The result was "a better deal than when we started," Mitchell said. Union members voted to approve the offer Oct. 4.

"The Society prides itself on its record of negotiating strong collective agreements for our members that are fair for everyone," Society President **Michelle Johnston** said. "These professionals fought hard for a good deal, and now they can return to the work they do so well."

SUP represents about 9,000 professional people working for public, private and non-profit employers in Ontario.

As new Area Reps come in, SPEEA adds them to the database for email distribution when SPEEA sends a message to Council Reps and Area Reps. Many Council Reps hold monthly Area Rep meetings to have discussions and share updates.
